Longstone Edge hill climb

Great Longstone – Wednesday 28th June

Promoted by Peak Road Club and myHill Cycling.

THE YOUNGSTERS GIVE THE SENIORS A LESSON IN HILLCLIMBING.

"Old age and treachery will always beat youth and exuberance" is a saying which Isacc Oliver has clearly never heard of or, if he has, has chosen to ignore. The young star, representing Sheffield Youth CC, celebrated his 16th birthday in style by posting the fasted overall time in the 4th edition of the Longstone Edge hill climb and, in doing so, schooled a number of established hill climbers with the most significant being national medalist, and lead rider for the mighty Team Lifting Gear Products, Andy Nichols. Just 5 days previously Nichols had got the better of Oliver by the margin of 0.1 of a second in the Sheffrec CC promotion at Bradfield. During a brief prerace conversation before the Longstone event, Oliver suggested that the longer race up Longstone would suit the older man. Clearly here is a young man who doesn't yet realise the extent of his talents.

The Peak RC/myHillCycling.co.uk promotion on Longstone Edge was the 3rd out of 4 events in the Peak District Summer hill climb series so, with both individual race and series honours at stake, there was plenty to race for.

As is now the tradition, the action was started by the juvenile competitors and the first of eight age records broken on a deceptively fast evening went to rider number 6, Cody Bassett (Derby Mercury CC) who updated the 12-year-old boys record with a magnificent 6-32.7. A time which would see him hold the lead for 8 minutes.

Two minutes after Bassett in the start order, was 11-year-old Olivia Marriott (Derby Mercury CC), who came within 4 seconds of the age record held by none other than Maia Howell. Marriott will surely come back next year to take on the 12-year-old record with it being only 1 second faster than the time she posted this year.

Spare a thought for rider number 11, Alfie Astles (Matlock CC). Astles scorched to a new 9-year-old record with an excellent 8-25.7 only to see his time beaten less than 2 minutes later by George Anthony, also of Matlock CC, with a time of 7-57.5. An astonishing time for someone so young. Both Astles and Anthony's times were faster than the current record for a 10-year-old boy, so it will be fascinating to see who comes out on top if they both return next year when they are one year older and one year stronger. Bassett's reign at the top finally came to an end with the appearance of number 14, Alfie Nott (Sheffield Youth CC) who set the first time under 6 minutes with a creditable time of 5-46.4 but, this didn't last long as 2 minutes later Finlay Hudson (Matlock CC) streaked across the line in 5-37.7. With this performance Hudson not only took the lead, he also updated the 13-year-old boys record held previously by none other than his older brother Harry. Harry Hudson (Matlock CC), now 15 years old, asserted himself shortly after with a sensational time of 4-49.4. This performance earnt Hudson the juvenile win, a new 15-year-old boys record and the overall juvenile record. More importantly he also restored calm to the Hudson family dinner table with both siblings having cause to be happy with their evening's work. In amongst all of this excitement, Maia Howell (Matlock CC), breezed up the climb in 6-25.2 for a clear victory in the girl's race. This time set a new record for a 14-year-old and also netted her the overall record for the juvenile category. A truly remarkable performance given her race schedule over the previous 4 days which saw Howell win a 2-day stage race in London before winning a hill climb event at Winster the day after. Three races, three wins, and all within five days.

After the juvenile race, the 6 senior women took to the line and it was the remarkable Yvonne Twelvetree (Sheffield Triathlon Club) who, at 72 years of age, updated her own over 70s record with 08-51.8. As Mark Twain once said; "Age is an issue of mind over matter. If you don't mind, it doesn't matter". Twelvetree clearly doesn't mind.

The next age record on a busy evening of rapid times went to Sally Maitland (Ratae RC) who took the V50, and the overall veterans record, with a stunning time of 6-55.2. Maitland already has her eye on the national championships in October, and after this dominant demonstration, the 55-59 age group national medal is clearly within her reach. Maitland was, however, surprised by her performance but on the evidence of this race she needs to get used to winning. The senior women's podium was completed by Josie Cram (PMRR) with 7-02.8 and last year's winner Lilja Raine who settled for 3rd place with 7-09.0. None of the seniors, however, were unable to unseat Maia Howell as the fastest female rider on the night.

Youngsters 1: Seniors 0.

When the senior men's race got under way, the question was how would Harry Hudson's time stand up to the senior men? The answer was extremely well as it took until the 3rd rider from the end, Andy Nichols, to finally unseat Hudson with a time of 4-45.7. Nichols wasn't sure if he'd done enough for the overall win and, as he waited at the finish line, Isaac Oliver soon appeared around the last bend and flashed across the line trimming Nichol's time by just 0.8 of a second. Youngsters 2: Seniors 0. Agonisingly close for Nichols, but delight for Oliver, as he not only took a took a notable senior win, he also bagged the overall junior record. Significantly, at only 16, Oliver is already homing in on the 4 minutes 30 mark; a barrier only previously broken twice.

Back at the race headquarters, the après race chat was this year accompanied with tea, coffee and cake courtesy of the local community. Having refreshments laid on was a first for this event and is something that will hopefully become a feature in future editions, so many thanks go to Jane Littlefield for arranging this. Along with the local community support, this is an event which owes its success to so many people and organisations. Thanks go to Great Longstone Parish Council who once again put their full support behind the event. Having a closed road means that there is no age limit for competitors, and it was a wonderful spectacle to see so many youngsters taking part, so thanks go to the residents of Moor Road and the owners of Dale Farm for supporting the road closure and enabling so many young riders to take part.

The organisers are aware that the event does take place within private land, so many thanks are extended to Stuart Fairfax of Longstone Moor Farm for his support. Can I also extend thanks to Robert Thornhill who generously offered one of his paddocks for competitors parking again this year. Once again, the only disappointment of the evening was the small field of 50 competitors. Like many events we struggled with numbers this year, and we can only hope that in future we will have 100+competitors as in previous years.
